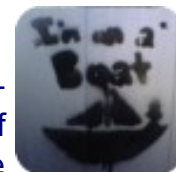
## Ceremonies Team(s)

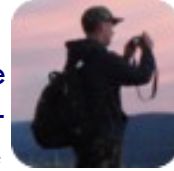
